Provides case management services for children and families. Assigns, prioritizes, and reviews work assignments of Social Workers. Provides consultation and direction in handling cases. Delegates duties to subordinate staff as appropriate and oversees schedules of program staff to ensure maximum services to clients.

- Ability to multi-task and manage a large volume of work.
- Ability to communicate effectively with other agencies and community groups.
- Ability to communicate appropriately with and follow chain of command.
- Ability to develop and maintain effective working relationships with a wide range and level of staff and clientele.
- Ability to review and evaluate employee job performances.
- Ability to conduct interviews with clientele or job applicants.
